Fact Corner

A need was seen by members of this and surrounding communities to provide pregnancy alternatives to individuals and families faced with crisis pregnancy situations. In 1985, this group banded together to form a Steering Committee. The purpose was to do a community search and form an organization that would provide these alternatives to island communities. The Clinic By-Laws and Articles of Incorporation were written with the expert help of Attorney Ken Manni. The name chosen for the Center at that time was Crisis Pregnancy Center of Whidbey Island. It was later changed to Inter-Island Pregnancy Care Center to better describe the area served by the ministry as well as the function of the ministry. The official opening of the Oak Harbor office was September 1986. An extension satellite office was opened in Anacortes in December 1993 and operated until December 31, 2006.

The Center was renamed The Pregnancy Care Clinic when it became a medical test site in 1999.

STD testing was offered from 2004 until 2008.

A new clinic was opened in 2005 in Langley and is currently assisting clients on South Whidbey.

Mission Statement

The Pregnancy Care Clinic (PCC) is an outreach of Jesus Christ through His church. The PCC is committed to encourage life-affirming decisions to ensure each pre-born baby is carried to term, to empower with sexual integrity education and to offer hope found exclusively in the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Purpose Statement

The purpose of the PCC is to see individuals make life-affirming decisions for their pre-born children by offering compassionate, non-judgmental counsel and education, as well as providing practical needs in whatever form is available and needed. The PCC will encourage and empower through education in sexual integrity and provide hope and healing to those who are experiencing the after-effects of abortion.

Status

The PCC is a non-profit 501(c)(3) charitable organization registered with the Secretary of State in Washington and with the IRS. The Clinics are supported solely by donations from churches, businesses, organizations, individuals and fund-raising events. No government or tax money is received or sought by this ministry. The principle that we stand by is that the Church of Jesus Christ reaches out through concern and love to those in need providing whatever help is needed with available resources.

Affiliations

The PCC is affiliated with the **National Institute of Family and Life Advocates** and **Heartbeat International**. These organizations provide a balance of legal assistance, advice, counsel and training to the Clinic staff and board. They also provide assistance and training in the form of written materials, consultations, instruction at conferences and production of administrative and legal forms for use in the day-to-day operations.

Local Level

The PCC is locally governed by an active Board of Directors. There are seven paid staff members. Volunteers are the backbone of the PCC ministry. Volunteers receive twenty hours of intense training to minister to clients in crisis and meet needs. Orientation on the job involves observing and being observed working with clients. For many volunteers it takes 4-6 months to complete all the requirements. It takes commitment to be a PCC volunteer.
